

### REMEMBER, HONOR, CELEBRATE: ALTAR EXHIBITION

Día de los Muertos, or Day of the Dead, is considered one of the most important cultural celebrations in Latin America. With ancient roots in Mesoamerica, the celebration as we know it today is largely a combination of indigenous and European cultural practices that demonstrates the culture's strong sense of love and respect for one's ancestors, while celebrating the continuance of life. At the heart of the celebration of Día de los Muertos is the altar—a multitiered, ritual platform where offerings, or *ofrendas*, for the dead are placed.

In conjunction with Denver Botanic Gardens' annual celebration of Día de los Muertos, we have expanded into a month-long Days of the Dead event with two exhibits and related programs in an effort to further educate and inspire our diverse community as well as create connections to a shared past.

Denver Botanic Gardens invites artists, community groups, and individuals to create and display an *ofrenda* (altar or shrine) inside a large—scale *nicho* -- to pay homage to someone special, a group of people, or a cause – that will be displayed in the first annual outdoor Days of the Dead exhibition.

#### WHAT IS A NICHO?



Dating back to the Spanish Colonial period, the tradition of creating ornately decorated tin plate frames, or *nichos*, has come to define Mexican folk art. *Nichos* are small, hand-made tin boxes constructed to display lovingly crafted scenarios.

Many Day of the Dead altars will include *nichos* as a way of rendering tribute to a person of great significance to the artist. This 3-dimensional box is often decorated by a variety of images or objects and can be accentuated with bright colors. Each is unique, acting as a showcase for that artist's character – containing political themes, images of saints or other deities, even depictions of everyday life. The nicho is a statement that demonstrates that which is important to the creator.

What to Bring	<ul> <li>Necessary items for creating your ofrendas such as photos, flowers (preferably fake), and any personal items belonging to your loved ones.</li> <li>Unopened bottles of drinks</li> <li>Hooks for hanging your items within your nicho</li> <li>Tablecloths</li> <li>LED candles</li> <li>Unopened items of food</li> </ul> NO ALCOHOL or REAL FOOD!

#### **FAQs**

### Is there a fee to participate?

There is no cost to participate in the exhibit.

What type of media/materials can I use for my ofrenda? Does it have to be traditional? We encourage participants to interpret the idea of the *nicho* in any way they wish. Denver Botanic Gardens will provide ready-made structures for the participants, however artists must provide all other materials and equipment, including photos and glue, if applicable. Organic materials, including plants and food, are not allowed in the structures.

#### When is the installation and de-installation of *nichos*?

Installation takes place October 7 and 8 during regular business hours (9 a.m. -5 p.m.). De-installation must take place either on Monday, November 7 from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m. or Tuesday, November 8, from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m. *Ofrendas* not dismantled by 5 p.m.on November 9 with be dismantled and disposed of.

### Will I be able to add items to my altar once the exhibit opens?

No. Once the exhibit opens, you will not be allowed to access your *ofrenda*. We encourage you to bring all necessary items for display during installation times.
