Denver Botanic Gardens' Spring Plant Sale takes place throughout the York Street location with a robust selection of plants for gardeners of every skill level and interest. Many plant species are not easily sourced at other retailers and the Gardens' expert horticulturists offer plant selection advice and care tips based on the guest's unique yard conditions. The Sale takes place **Friday and Saturday, May 9-10, 8 a.m. – 6 p.m. Last entry is 5 p.m. Admission is free, but reservations are required.**

Spring Plant Sale Preview Party, on Thursday, May 8, 4-7:30 p.m., provides early access to unique plants before the sale opens to the public. Guests enjoy light treats, wine and beer. Tickets are \$60, \$65 at the door (if still available).

Plant inventory includes the largest ever inventories of Grown at the Gardens, herbs, water-smart and vegetables. Grown at the Gardens selections provide one-of-a-kind plants that our horticulturists curate to accommodate the dry and hot Colorado climate while supporting pollinators and small animals. Another unique offering is the Container Garden in a Bag that features plants and easy-to-follow instructions to create beautiful, planted containers ideal for a porch, balcony or patio. Additional plant categories are annuals, aquatics, fruits and berries, houseplants, Plant Select®, rock alpine, roses and summer bulbs.

- Preview Party tickets go on sale April 8, 10 a.m.
- Free reservations for May 9-10 are available April 23-27 for members. Accessed based on membership level.
- General public reservations open April 28, 10 a.m.
- Member-only shopping is available from 8-9 a.m. both days. Reservations are required.
- Reservations are subject to availability; morning slots sell out first.

- Members receive 10 percent off all purchases (must present proof of active membership).
- Credit/debit cards and checks are the only accepted forms of payment.
- Hive Garden Bistro and Offshoots Café will be open.
- The Boettcher Memorial Tropical Conservatory and the Science Pyramid will be closed.

Shopping Tips:

- Allow extra time to find parking
- Browse the plant catalog ahead of time to plan your visit.
- A limited number of shopping carts are available. Please bring a wagon or cart to transport plants.
- Most of the event takes place outdoors and is rain or shine.
- Free plant valet with car loading assistance.
